 Example: **START** in California. Go two states north (1-Oregon, 2-Washington), then one state east (1-Idaho). **STOP**: IDAHO








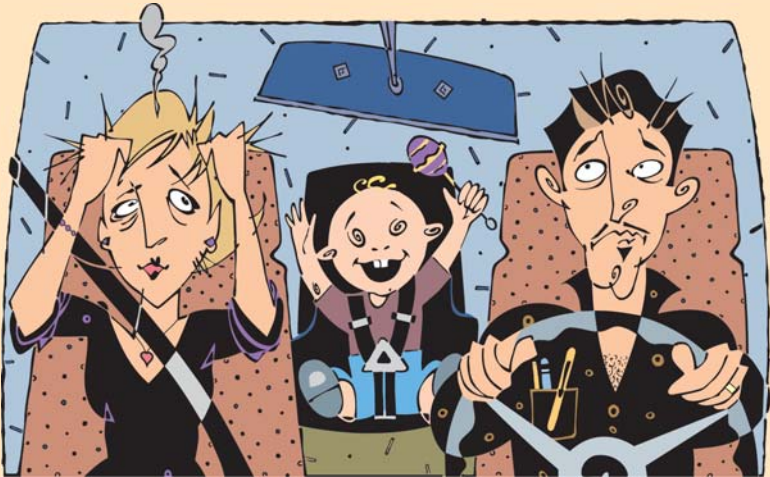
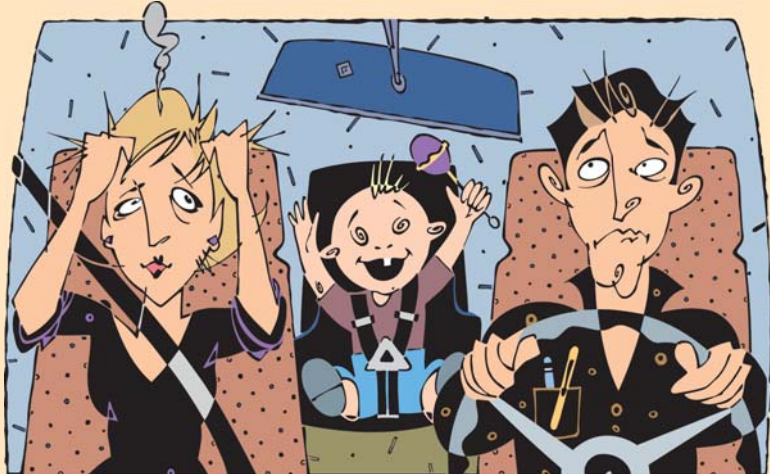
